The Course

The course in Blairmore, just to the north of highway as you come into Blairmore from the east, might not be much to look at from the highway, but after a mere two holes you are in the mountains, and level ground will become a tough thing to find. Every hole has some slope to it, but the surroundings make it a thing of beauty. Costs are reasonable (<\$60 for

your round and cart), carts have been reserved (believe me, walking won't be an option here), and be sure to bring some extra golf balls!

The following is a list of those golfers who have committed to attending the GASP in 2004.



The Campground

Campsites were a difficult thing to find in the Crowsnest Pass, even though campgrounds seem to abound. The best that I first found was the Crowsnest Mountain Resort, although it has only two RV sites available (the rest are booked for the entire season). Both sites, and some cabins were reserved; however, on May 17th I found out that they have no washrooms, nor do they encourage camping in tents due to a bear problem. This certainly didn't seem to fit with our normal camping requirements, so the search was on again. When all other campgrounds failed to meet our needs, a conversation with Joe and Lyle determined that we go back to Sparwood.

Sparwood is about a 25 minute drive to the golf course, but we know what the campground has to offer, and a conversation with the manager ("crazy" Doug if you recall) showed he was happy to accommodate us. Therefore, for those who don't mind the extra travel before and after the round, we will be staying in the same campground as we did a few years ago. Sites 34, 35, 36, 37, and 38 are reserved for us (we had sites 36, 37, 38, and 51 last time), beginning on June 24. If you wish to stay longer, either before or after, just give Doug a call at the number on the previous page, let him know you're with the GASP Golf tournament, and he'll take care of your camping needs.



For those who haven't been to the campground before, you will locate the facility on the east side of the #3 highway, just south of the Sparwood golf course. And as a reminder, the electrical outlets are 240 V, so you'll need your 240 120 V adapters. All sites are equipped with power and water (and sewer if you need it), and the showers were free when we were last there.
